June marked the kick-off of our VACATION READING CLUB and many exciting activities associated with our theme, *BUILD A BETTER WORLD*. Our lineup included a program from Paleontologists Mike and Roberta Straka, who shared interesting dino-



saur facts as well as fossils they uncovered on their "digs." They guided us on a "dig" in which we discovered fossils and then we raced to reconstruct a triceratops.

The following week, MIDDLETOWN DUCK DONUTS sent two helpers to teach us how to construct a donut paradise of our own. We built



chocolate iced donuts with chocolate sprinkles, Oreo bits and rainbow sprinkles, strawberry-iced donuts with rainbow sprinkles and vanilla-iced donuts with the works! We thank Duck Donuts for donating their time and their delicious donuts!

ith the school year approaching, here are a few friendly reminders that will assist the students getting to and from school safely.

**HELMET LAW:** New Jersey law mandates that a person under 17 years of age shall not operate a bicycle or skateboard unless that person is wearing a properly fitted and fastened helmet which meets the standards of the American National Standards Institute.

ROAD CLOSED TO ALL VEHICULAR TRAFFIC: The length of Third Street will be closed to ALL vehicular traffic between the hours of 7:30-8:30 am and 2:45-3:45 pm. The ONLY exceptions will be for those who reside on Third St or an adjoining street (Church St, Maple Ave, Allen St, Williams St, Cedar Ave, Country Ln).
