CONGRATULATIONS TO POLICE CHIEF JOE McGOVERN

I am very pleased to announce that on April 25, 2016, in a meeting room packed beyond capacity with officials, family, friends and colleagues, from near and far, former Captain Joseph McGovern was sworn in as Fair Haven's new Police Chief.

Mayor Ben Lucarelli swore in Chief McGovern at a brief ceremony that took place at the beginning of a Borough Council meeting. Captain McGovern's promotion to Chief came nearly seven months after the retirement of former Chief, Darryl Breckenridge, who was also in attendance to show his support for the Borough's new Chief of Police.

Chief McGovern grew up in Holmdel and said he chose law enforcement for the same reason many others do: because of the influence from a relative, in his case, a brother-in-law who was a policeman. Chief McGovern holds a BA in Business Administration from Fairleigh Dickinson University and he also attended the prestigious FBI Training Academy.

Chief McGovern began his career with the department in 1987 as a Dispatcher. He became a special officer in 1989, and in 1991 he was hired as a Probationary Patrolman. For several years he was head of the departments Detective Bureau. He is also the Borough's Office of Emergency Management Coordinator, a position that he will still hold as Chief. In 2006, he was promoted to Sergeant. In 2008, he rose to the rank of Lieutenant and then in August 2015 he was promoted to Captain. Since October 2015, he has been the Acting Chief of the department. Chief McGovern is highly respected by the members and staff of the Police Department, as well as his peers and the community members. Chief McGovern oversees twelve full-time officers, four part-time employees and a budget of about 1.4 million dollars.

Chief McGovern lives in town with his wife, Theresa and his two sons, Joseph and Peter. Both boys are students at Rumson-Fair Haven Regional High School. Chief McGovern thanked everyone for their support, especially the officers with whom he has served for decades and said he looked forward to keeping the department top-notch.



RIVER ROAD STREETSCAPE COMPLETED

I am very pleased to report that the Borough will finally be completing the very well designed River Road Streetscape Project, which has completely connected and revitalized the entire down town area.

The third and final phase of this project, which is nearing completion as I write this article, is the Streetscape East portion, which extends from Oak Place east to the Rumson border.

There was a time when the eastern portion of the Borough's business district was struggling and I am so pleased that it is now thriving, with new growth and investment recently approved by the Borough's Planning Board. The great majority of the funding for the Borough's three streetscape projects came from over 1.3 million dollars in grants, which were awarded to the Borough over the past eight years.

My predecessor, Mary Howell, Borough Engineer, Rich Gardella, and the members of the Fair Haven Governing Body, past and present, are to be commended for having the vision, skill, and dedication to bring all three phases of this very worthwhile project to fruition, at minimal cost to Borough taxpayers.

Mayor and Council Approve a \$500,000.00 Bond Ordinance To Purchase a New Fire Truck for the Fair Haven Fire Department

After forty one years of faithful service to the Borough, the Fair Haven Fire Department recently retired a 1976 Mack fire truck, known as Engine 1372 and accepted delivery of a new state of the art fire truck, which is a 2016 Pierce pumper that will be known as the new Engine #1372. The purchase of the truck and related equipment represent an investment of \$500,000 of Fair Haven Taxpayer dollars. This expenditure was approved by Fair Haven's Mayor and Council and will be paid for through the municipal budget's debt service line item for the next ten years. The Mayor and Council, representing the residents of the Borough, authorized the purchase of the truck as part of the community's ongoing and continuing commitment to Fair Haven's outstanding, all volunteer, Fire Department.

This is the second fire truck that the Borough has purchased for the FHFD in an eight year period of time. In 2008, the average age of the Borough's fire truck fleet was 1970 or 38 years old; however, in 2016 the average age of the fire truck fleet has been reduced to 2001 or 15 years old. This investment of Borough capital funds will serve the residents of this fine community for many years to come. The Mayor and Council want to recognize and applaud the Fair Haven Fire Department for their outstanding record of working diligently on the maintenance of their fire truck fleet, as evidenced by the fact that they have managed to keep their trucks in service far beyond the average useful life for this type of emergency response vehicle.

1372 Retired and New 1372 In Service

(Old) Engine 1372: 1976 Mack CF 600 pumper refurbished and updated in 1990 by Pierce Manufacturing which included a completely new body to match current engine 1373 (1981 Pierce Arrow Pumper). This engine measured 27 feet in length and 96 inches wide. It had a 1250 gallon per minute two-stage Waterous pump and a 500 gallon steel water tank. It was powered by a Mack 6-cylinder diesel engine with five-speed manual transmission. This engine held (11) firefighters.





(New) Engine 1372: 2016 Pierce Enforcer, 8 man fully enclosed cab, 1500 gallon per minute Two-Stage Pump, 500 gallon tank, 10Kw Harrison hydraulic generator, Whelen light package, enclosed ladders/tool storage, Bullard infrared camera, Motorola APX6500 mobile & Tait TP8115 portable radios.

In closing, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the volunteers who serve this fine Borough on an ongoing basis. Your collective dedication helps to make Fair Haven a great place to live and work. Garden Club of Fair Haven




Members of the garden club thank our friends and neighbors who came out and supported our Plant Sale! We appreciate all your support and we always enjoy spending time with fellow gardeners!

CRIME PREVENTION

Fraudulent Scams - There have been reports of residents receiving calls from someone claiming to be part of the IRS and asking for personal information. The IRS will never call you on the phone, they will only mail out letters. If you receive a similar call, it is best not to answer it if your Caller ID identifies the organization or if it is an unfamiliar number. If you do answer, simply ask them to send their information by mail and hang up. Under no circumstances should you provide them with any personal information such as your name, birth date, social security number, bank accounts, etc.

Solicitors - If a solicitor comes to your door please ask them to see their ID and permit. Never let anyone in your home and report the incident immediately, as the police will know who is permitted to be in town soliciting.
