Borough Administrator's Notes

THANKFULLY, HELP IS ON THE WAY

Many years ago, my father had a heart attack in our family home; I still remember the feeling of panic, as my mother and I tended to him, while we waited for help to arrive. To me, from the moment we called 911 to the time our local police and first aid arrived seemed like forever, but in reality it was probably only minutes. However, what I remember most about that day is hearing the sounds of the sirens; initially, they were off in the distance, but I could clearly hear them coming closer and closer. At such a difficult time, what a comfort it was for us to know that help was on the way and that we were not alone.

Many years later, my son is now a member of the very same volunteer First Aid Squad; I sometimes hear his pager go off several times a night and I am reminded that, somewhere in our community, someone is waiting to hear those same sirens, telling them help is on the way. Here in Fair Haven, we are so fortunate to have volunteer First Aid and Fire Departments that are among the finest in all of New Jersey. Our First Aid and Fire

Departments have responded to countless calls over the years, many of them involved very serious injuries and dangerous conditions. Tending to a severe injury, coordinating the landing of a helicopter in Fair Haven Fields, going into a burning building, or driving using lights and sirens are all very stressful tasks. I am very thankful and proud to say that, through the combined efforts of our Fire Department, First Aid Squad, Fire Police and

our fine Police Department, we can all rest assured that we will be well covered in any emergency. While you may never personally need this level of help, or expertise, to save your life, or property; surely, as a resident of Fair Haven, you can take pride and comfort knowing that the sound of sirens does mean that really qualified help is on the way!

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

The Borough of Fair Haven has an ongoing commitment to pedestrian safety within the Borough. In 2013 the



Mayor and Council adopted a Complete Streets Policy, the goal of which is to improve safety for pedestrians, bicyclists, children, senior citizens, non-drivers and the mobility challenged. We pay particular attention to the safety of our school aged population, the majority of who walk or bike to our two elementary schools. We recently enhanced pedestrian safety in the areas leading to Fair Haven Fields and McCarter Park as part of our capital improvement projects in those parks. Additionally, Mayor Lucarelli is presently working with multiple state and county agencies on a variety of bicycle safety initiatives, for Fair Haven and neighboring communities. On behalf of the Mayor and Council, as well as our residents, I encourage everyone to please be mindful of pe-

destrian safety at all times.

Fair Haven First Aid Squad Kicks off its Fund Drive

The Fair Haven First Aid Squad for more than **85** years has been providing dedicated service to the community and turning to the residents and businesses for its annual fund drive.

Just as area residents and businesses depend on the squad to be there when they call 9-1-1, the organization depends on generous donations from the community to survive.

The Fair Haven First Aid Squad annual fund drive letter was recently mailed to all homes and businesses in the Borough. Each year the **tax-deducible** donations go directly to purchasing medical supplies, equipment and help off-set the cost of keeping members trained to professional standards.

Through your generous donations over the past years, we have now been able to place an order to purchase a new light duty first responder vehicle, a 2016 4-wheel drive Chevy Tahoe (1355), to replace our old 2006 first responder vehicle. The new vehicle will carry all our basic life support equipment including a defibrillator. Total expenses for the new vehicle and modification to carry equipment was about \$65,000. This purchase could not be made without the generosity of the community and their support of our fund raising efforts each year. The addition of this vehicle to our First Aid Squad solidifies our mission to provide the best and safest emergency service to the Borough of Fair Haven. Your continued support is greatly appreciated by all our members

During 2014, we answered <u>440</u> emergency calls and donated <u>2909</u> man-hours to our activities.

Our members contribute many hours answering emergency medical calls, responding to vehicular accidents, fires, participating in drills and continuing education activities. They also participate in demonstrations for local schools, scouts and other organizations.

The Fair Haven First Aid Squad does not charge for any of its services. Our Squad is actively replacing outdated equipment and adding new equipment that meets or exceeds state standards.

Traffic Safety—Reminder that Third Street is closed on school days between 7:30 am-8:30 am and 2:30 pm-3:30 pm. Please find an alternate route and do not cross over Third Street as to interfere with pedestrian and bicycle traffic. Our goal is to keep our children safe as they travel to and from school. Parents are reminded to make sure their children have their helmets on before they ride their bike if they are under the age of 17 years old and that they always stay to the right side of the roadway and ride single file.



Abide by all of the traffic laws including stop signs, speed limits and pedestrian's right of way. This time of year our streets are crowded with vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic. Following all traffic laws is the first step to keeping our roadways safe.

Crime Prevention—Please make sure your house number is visible from the street. In the event that emergency vehicles need to respond to your house or another on your street, this will help to identify the proper address.

Mischief Night—On Mischief Night the curfew is 7:00 pm for anyone under the age of 18 years old and not accompanied by a parent or guardian. Anyone found that night to have anything in their possession that can be used to vandalize property will be in violation. (i.e... toilet paper, shaving cream, eggs, etc...)

Halloween—Safety is our main goal this year. Please make sure your children stay in groups with a parent present. Know the route your child will be taking if they are going with another parent. Make sure all children are visible at night with some form of a light (i.e... glow stick). Report any suspicious activity immediately. Curfew is 8:00 pm for anyone under the age of 18 and not accompanied by a parent or guardian.
