A RIVER RUNS THROUGH THE HEART AND SOUL OF FAIR HAVEN

As you may have read in several local media outlets, our beautiful and beloved Navesink River has recently been identified as having high levels of fecal coliform pollutants. Last year, this contamination caused the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to prohibit shell fishing in 565.7 acres of the Navesink, west of the Oceanic Bridge.

I want to assure the Fair Haven community that the Mayor and Council, the Borough's professional staff, the Borough's Environmental Commission, and surely our residents, take the Borough's commitment to a clean river very seriously. The Borough is working on multiple levels, in cooperation with other state and local agencies, to identify and eliminate the sources of the pollution with a goal of restoring the river to a clean and healthy body of water, as quickly as possible.

In support of that goal, the Governing Body recently appointed Environmental Commission member, Brian Rice and Councilman Eric Jaeger to the newly reestablished Navesink River Municipalities Committee which meets at the Red Bank Municipal Complex, 90 Monmouth St. on the third Wednesday of the month at 7:30 p.m., with the meetings open to the public. Member communities include: Red Bank, Tinton Falls, Fair Haven, Rumson, and Middletown. Additionally, the Borough's Engineering Department has been working with the Rutgers Cooperative Extension Water Resources Program on a very comprehensive Impervious Cover Assessment, which will lead to new Borough Ordinances that will further enhance our local Storm Water Management Regulations. Clean Ocean Action has been working with Fair Haven and our neighboring communities to identify the sources of sewage contamination through the use of Environmental Canine Services, which uses dogs to sniff out human waste.

Fair Haven is also working with the American Littoral Society and the Rutgers Cooperative Extension Water Resources Program on the design of the Borough's newly acquired property at the terminus of DeNormandie Avenue. The goal is to design a passive park, which includes bank stabilization and a series of natural water filtering systems, which will stop the sheet flow of rainwater directly into the Navesink River. The Borough has applied for a series of grants to help offset the cost of these projects. We also greatly encourage all of our residents to be mindful of what goes into our storm drains, as well as, what you put onto your lawns. We ask you to properly dispose of pet waste so it doesn't end up in our beloved river.





Fair Haven First Aid Squad Kicks off its Fund Drive

The Fair Haven First Aid Squad, for more than 86 years, has been providing dedicated service to the community and turning to the residents and businesses for its annual fund drive.

Iust as area residents and businesses depend on the squad to be there when they call 9-1-1, the organization depends on generous donations from the community to survive.

The Fair Haven First Aid Squad annual fund drive letter was recently mailed to all homes and businesses in the Borough. Each year the taxdeductible donations go directly to purchasing medical supplies, equipment and help off-set the cost of keeping members trained to professional standards.

Through your generous donations over the past years, we have now been able to purchase a new light duty first responder vehicle, a 2016 4-wheel drive Chevy Tahoe(1355), to replace our old 2006 first responder vehicle. The new vehicle carries all our basic life support equipment including a defibrillator. Total expenses for the new vehicle, new radios and modification to carry equipment This purchase could not be made was \$65,000. without the generosity of the community and their support of our fundraising efforts each year. The addition of this vehicle to our First Aid Squad solidifies our mission to provide the best and safest emergency service to the Borough of Fair Haven. Your continued support is greatly appreciated by all our members

During 2015, we answered 423 emergency calls and donated 2914 volunteer hours to our activities.

Our members contribute many hours answering emergency medical calls, responding to vehicular accidents, fires, participating in drills and continuing education activities. They also participate in demonstrations for local schools, scouts and other organizations.

The Fair Haven First Aid Squad does not charge for any of its services. Our Squad is actively replacing outdated equipment and adding new equipment that meets or exceeds State standards.


DON'T FORGET TO LICENSE YOUR PET!!


All dog and cat licenses expire annually on December 31 and must be **renewed by January 31st** each year. All dogs and cats must have a current rabies vaccination to renew or obtain a new license. Unless your dog or cat was vaccinated at the Fair Haven Rabies Clinic, a Certification of Rabies Vaccination from a veterinarian must accompany your license application. After January 31st there will be an additional fee of \$5.00 per month.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

HELMET LAW: Anyone under the age of 17 is required to wear a helmet while riding a bicycle, skateboard, scooter, etc. More children, ages 5-14, go to emergency rooms for bicycle-related injuries than with any other sport; many are head injuries. Helmets are the single most effective piece of safety equipment for riders of all ages, if you crash. Please make sure your child is protected.

PEDESTRIANS: Remain vigilant when driving, especially through our school zones, near our parks and our downtown area. Your view of pedestrians can be obstructed by telephone poles, street lamps, hedges and parked vehicles.
