Dear Residents,

Well, it has been quite a year so far, and despite our troubles, we have much to be thankful for. COVID has taken much; suspended employment, closed businesses and curtailed our freedom and liberty for the sake of public health. And now, at the end of August, we enter what should have been the Fair week, which has signaled the end of summer and back-to-school for decades; an event that defines what makes this town so wonderful. We will all miss this tradition, especially the remarkable members of the Fair

Haven Fire Company who dedicate so much of their time and labor to put on the best Fireman's Fair in New Jersey.

The Board of Education, Superintendent McNeil and his staff are working diligently to prepare for back to school in whatever form that may take.

In the wake of Tropical Storm Isaias, we bore witness to another aspect which makes our town so special, a community coming together to recover from a devastating storm. We should be thankful for our Police Department that kept us safe and checked in on our most vulnerable, our DPW Staff that worked untold hours clearing our streets; our First Responders ever ready to answer the call, and our Borough Council and administrative staff that supported the efforts and communicated with our residents. Much to be thankful for.

This Fall, Monmouth County will be paving River Road from Lake Avenue to Buena Vista Avenue. The Council recently voted to extend our streetscape design from Smith Street to Lake Avenue with sidewalks, streetlights and distinctive crosswalks. In the coming weeks, we will be discussing the installation of a Bicycle/Pedestrian design developed in accordance with our Active Transportation Plan. This installation will include bike lanes from Lake Avenue to Hance Road and sharrows from Hance Road to Buena Vista Avenue, along with pedestrian crosswalks and signage. Information on this design can be viewed on our Website, which includes references to the design concepts employed.

We will also be working to finalize the details for the form and location of our new DPW and Police facilities.

Enjoy the end of summer.

River Road Project



Monmouth County will be paving River Road in the late fall and the Governing Body is considering the pros and cons of introducing bike lanes along this route. The project design includes standard bike lanes in some areas of the River Road corridor and it also introduces "sharrows" for a portion of the project. The sharrow design proposal is not designed as a way of directing local cyclists onto a busy portion of River Road, it simply accounts for the fact that cyclists are already using River Road on a regular basis and this project seeks to improve safety for those travelers.

The design acknowledges that, given a choice, most local residents would most likely prefer to use alternate routes within Fair Haven, which is the true value of the network approach that is further enhanced by local knowledge. Additionally, local bicycle riders may be making more leisurely trips within the town, with sufficient time to use local alternate routes. The current recommendations are an incremental step towards improving driver awareness and they reinforce the need to protect the safety of cyclists and pedestrians, who by necessity or choice find themselves on the County roadway. The Mayor and Council, with the support of Chief McGovern, have also recently submitted an official request to Monmouth County's Department of Engineering to reduce the speed limit on River Road to 25 MPH.

Fair Haven Volunteer First Aid Squad Kicks off its 2020 Fund Drive

The Fair Haven Volunteer First Aid Squad has, for more than 90 years, provided dedicated service and support to the community and is asking the residents and businesses to support us during our annual fund drive.

Just as area residents and businesses depend on the squad to be there when they call 9-1-1, the organization depends on donations from the community to survive and provide that support.

The Squad would like to stress the importance of house numbers being visible from the street. Precious moments could be lost if a responding emergency vehicle must search for an unnumbered house.

Motorists should remember that state law requires you to yield right of way to vehicles displaying a flashing or revolving red or blue light.

The Fair Haven Volunteer First Aid Squad annual fund drive letter will be mailed out to all homes and businesses in the borough. Each year the tax-deductible donations go directly to purchasing medical supplies, equipment and help to off-set the cost of keeping members trained to increasing professional standards.

Last year (2019) the squad responded to 460 emergency calls and donated 2,896 man hours. Our members contribute many hours answering emergency medical calls, responding to vehicular accidents, fires, participating in drills, and continuing education activities. They also participate in demonstrations for local schools, scouts and other organizations, as well as providing mutual aid support for our surrounding communities.

Through your generous donations last year we were able to purchase 2 new 2019 Ford truck chassis and remounts and refurbish existing boxes (patient area); cost of around \$200,000.

This fund drive will be our main fund raiser. Due to Covid 19 there will be no FIREMEN'S FAIR, therefore, the first aid raffle has been cancelled.

The Fair Haven Volunteer First Aid Squad does not charge for any of its services. Our Squad is actively replacing outdated equipment and adding new equipment that meets or exceeds state standards.

A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water



ROAD CLOSED TO ALL VEHICULAR TRAFFIC
