EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

The Borough of Fair Haven has spent several years improving our ability to communicate with our residents, on both an individual and community-wide basis. We did so by upgrading hardware and software, taking advantage of all available media options and recently promoting Betty Ann Berube to Director of Communications.

In terms of non-emergency related information, the Borough regularly informs our residents of town-related events, road closures, police updates, library information, weekly meetings, etc., through multiple information outlets. The Borough sends out a variety of information through our "Borough Buzz" which uses the Constant Contact platform for email generated newsletters. We send out a bi-monthly newsletter by both USPS and email. Other social media platforms used are the Borough's Facebook page, Borough website and Instagram. The Borough uses the NIXLE platform to send out emails and texts for emergency and non-emergency information, inclusive of a reverse 911 feature for residents who still have landlines.

The ability to effectively communicate with our residents is essential on a day to day and ongoing basis, but it is most important during times of potential or actual emergencies. Please keep in mind that this type of ongoing communication does require residents to register with the Borough, so we have your email and/or phone number in our database. FAIR HAVEN SCHOOL DISTRICT PRESCHOOL PROGRAM



he Fair Haven School District will be offering an Integrated Preschool Program for the 2023-2024 school year. The integrated preschool program combines students with and without special needs. Children must be 3 years of age by July 1, 2023. If your child is of kindergarten age by October 1, 2023, your child isn't eligible.

This program follows the NJ State Department of Education's Preschool Teaching and Learning Expectations, Standards of Quality and taught by a certified teacher. Typically developing children, as well as, children with special needs, will be included in the program.

There are two preschool sections, morning and afternoon. The classes will meet 5 days a week for 2 hours and 20 minutes per day. The preschool program will follow the Fair Haven School District's 2023-2024 academic calendar.

Space is limited; a lottery will be conducted in January to select the children to fill the available slots. Should your child be selected, you will be notified by the end of January.

Please complete the FH School Preschool Parent Questionnaire by December 31, 2022 to begin the lottery process. You can find the questionnaire on the Sickles School website in the Special Services tab under "About Our School".

Fair Haven Police Department Bicycle Safety Advisory

- Bike Maintenance:
 - Check that your bicycle's tires have the proper air pressure.
 - Check that your bicycle's brakes are functional and in proper condition.
 - Check that your bicycle's chain is functional and in proper condition.
- Ride on the right side of the road and with traffic. It is the law.
- Always wear a proper fitting helmet
- Failing to yield the right of way is the highest factor in fatal bike crashes, followed by bicyclists not being visible. See and
- Avoid common distractions such as cell phones, exercise trackers and headphones. Pay attention.
- Avoid riding at night. If you must, your bicvcle must have a front headlamp and rear reflector.

Supporting local businesses is good for the environment because they often have a smaller carbon footprint than larger companies.



What is a Sharrow? You may have noticed the markings that were installed in a section of River Road. You may be wondering, "What is that?!?"



That is a sharrow. Sharrows are pavement markings that improve cycling safety on streets that are too narrow for traditional bike lanes. These markings indicate to drivers that the road is a preferred bicycle route, and that they should be prepared to share the road with cyclists. The placement of the sharrow shows cyclists where they can ride to avoid traveling in the door zone of parked cars.

Q. If I see these markings in a lane, is the lane only for bikes?

This marking is used for shared lanes; lanes that are used by bicyclists and motorists. Shared lanes are different than bike lanes which are set aside for bicyclists and are marked by a solid white line and a different symbol

Q. So, if I don't see these markings, then it's not a shared lane and bicyclists aren't supposed to be there?

No, cyclists can ride on any street except for limited access freeways and those with signs explicitly prohibiting cyclists. Cyclists are allowed on every street regardless of whether there is a marking or sign for them, unless stated otherwise.

HOLIDAY SHOPPING Safety Tips



- Always park in a well-lit and well-traveled area.
- When you are returning to your vehicle, check to make sure no one is following you.
- Remain vigilant by avoiding distractions, such as talking on your cell phone.
- Have your keys, in hand, prior to leaving the store so you will not be delayed by fumbling and looking for your keys.
- Store purchased items out of sight. The best place is in a locked trunk.
- Don't carry large amounts of cash. Use credit or debit
- **Don't resist** if someone tries to take your belongings. Try to get a good description and call 911 immediately.

"NOT HOME" for the HOLIDAYS-Safety Tips

- Lock up. Make sure every door and window in your home is properly shut and locked. Disable automatic garage doors.
- Avoid posting your whereabouts on social media. Do you really trust every one of your 274 "Friends" on Facebook?
- Put lights on a timer.
- Ask someone to pick up your mail or stop your mail. A buildup of mail is a tell-tale sign that no one is home.
- Keep valuables out of sight. Store jewelry, cash and prescription drugs in a safe. Hide larger valuables in unexpected locations.
- Set your burglar alarm.

ROAD CLOSURE REMINDER



During school days, the length of Third Street will be closed to ALL vehicular traffic between the hours of 7:30-8:45am and 2:30-3:45pm. PLAN BEFORE A FIRE

If a fire starts in your home, you may have as little as three minutes to escape. To be sure you and your family members get out quickly and safely, start planning and practicing your escape now!

Begin with a simple map of your home to plan two ways out of each room. Don't forget to identify a meeting place outside the front of your home. Next, practice your plan with a home fire drill. Push the test button on a smoke alarm and have everyone exit to your meeting place. School-age children should be encouraged to escape unaided in the event you can't help them. Finally, talk about how your drill went. Identify ways to improve and make a goal to have at least two a year, including one at night.

Leaf Pickup

As leaf season is upon us, please keep leaves at least 10 feet away from all storm drains to protect our streams and river.

For the safety of pedestrians, the beautification of our neighborhoods and to avoid a potential summons, please put ONLY your leaves to the curb 3-4 days before your assigned pick-up week, and tell your landscapers the same – refer to the Municipal Calendar or website for schedule details or call Borough Hall.

Place leaves clearly in front of your own property, not your neighbors – they will appreciate your kind consideration.

**Special Note: CONSIDER MULCHING YOUR LEAVES WITH A LAWN MOWER. The remaining leaf piles will be significantly smaller and/or mulched leaves will help to improve the health of your lawn.
