



Dear Fair Haven Neighbors,



While the most celebrated groundhogs may be Punxsutawney Phil and Staten Island Chuck, we have our very own groundhog, Fair Haven Fred. Every year, Fair Haven Fred predicts an early spring. Fifty percent of the time he is right, which is pretty impressive.

Speaking of Groundhog Day, every year at this time we begin to prepare the budget for the Borough. However, this year is very different because we are at an inflection point. At first-glance, the Fair Haven municipal spend for 2023 appears to be \$550,000 over the New Jersey State Appropriations Cap Allowance. We must therefore ensure that our budget is appropriately balanced.

We are committed to providing a continuum of key services to our residents, while also ensuring the proper maintenance of grounds, vehicles, and facilities, and considering new endeavors. This year's budget is currently undergoing a stringent review. The primary headwind in our budget is the increase in health insurance costs, which accounts for nearly \$300,000. Moreover, we are replacing our current Police Department building and renovating the Department of Public Works facility. We recognize that taxes were raised over the past few years, without taking into account these potential new expenses.

So, what does this mean for the year 2023?

We are going to be extremely diligent in where we spend funds. Unfortunately, that means saying "not now" for certain projects. We will prioritize all projects, balancing multiple factors in a matrix-type manner. This includes factors such as life/safety, cost, resource constraints, and grant guidelines (as applicable).

We are going to request creative funding solutions with projects brought to the Governing Body.

Our committees will receive increased communication, transparency, and flexibility for all decisions requiring financial expenditure and/or resources.

Please be assured, our Governing Body and Finance Committee are committed to being fiscally responsible and ensure we do what is best for Fair Haven.

In closing, I would like to congratulate the 8th Grade Mid-Monmouth Boys Basketball Team. They completed the most successful run in Fair Haven Basketball History by winning back to back Championships defeating a town with *seven times* our population in the Finals! An incredible feat that gives our small, yet strong, community a ton of pride, and will undoubtedly provide a lifetime of memories to the players, coaches, and parents involved.

Warmer weather is approaching. Big things are on the horizon for Fair Haven. Save the Date for the return of Fair Haven Day on June 10th! The journey continues. **Let's enjoy it together as one community!**

I have also received ongoing support and a great deal of very valuable input from many Borough residents, noting that I am very grateful to everyone who took the time to reach out to me. ### IMPORTANT BRUSH AND/OR LEAF PICK UP FACTS:

## -APRIL STARTS LEAF & BRUSH COLLECTION-

- It is very important that residents put brush and/or leaves to the curb no later than the weekend prior to your designated zone’s pick up week.
- Please note that the DPW will pick up brush and leaves only one time on your street, for each designated week. As such, it is essential that you have your brush and/or leaves to the curb no later than the Sunday night of your respective pick-up weeks.
- The DPW crew only does one pass on each street during your pick-up week. Once they pick up on your street, they will not return anytime later that week.
- If you miss the pick-up day on your street, or if you have additional brush and/or leaves after your street has been picked up, please keep the brush and/or leaves on your property, as opposed to in the street, until the weekend before your next designated pick-up week.
- All Landscapers are required to register annually with the Borough, at which time they are given a copy of our zone brush and leaf pick-up schedule to follow. Please speak to your landscaper and reinforce the need to follow the zone pick up schedule

## StormX Demonstration Project



The DPW installed the StormX outfall netting on the existing stormwater outfall pipe located at FH Dock. The StormX is an end of pipe netting system designed to capture floatables and pollutants and handle stormwater runoff. The StormX will capture litter and “first flush”

contaminants. As part of this demonstration project, the DPW will be monitoring and coordinating with the FH Environmental Commission on public outreach and awareness. Additional educational resources and links can be shared about the importance of Stormwater Management and various water quality

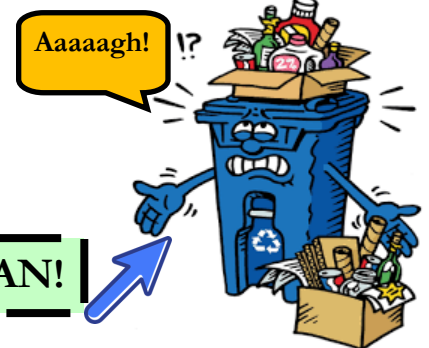

## Snow and Ice Removal

### from Vehicles and Sidewalks

#### **N.J.S.A. 39:4-77.1a – Failure to Remove Snow/Ice from Motor Vehicle**

Each driver of a motor vehicle, operated on a street or highway in this State, shall have an affirmative duty to make all reasonable efforts to remove accumulated ice or snow from exposed surfaces of the motor vehicle prior to operation. Surfaces shall include, but not be limited to, the hood, trunk, windshield, windows, roof of the motor vehicle, the cab of a truck, the top of a trailer or semitrailer being drawn by a motor vehicle and the top of an intermodal freight container being carried by an intermodal chassis. A person who violates the provisions of this subsection may be stopped on a street or highway by a law enforcement officer who believes the accumulated ice or snow may pose a threat to persons or property regardless of whether any snow or ice is dislodged from the motor vehicle.

## Special Needs Registry

In April 2016, the Monmouth County Special Needs Registry website began accepting new registrants. The goal of the registry is to ensure all Monmouth County residents who have special needs are able to get the help and support they need in a time of emergency or during interaction with Law Enforcement, Fire or EMS personnel. It is open to any person who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities due to a physical and/or intellectual disability. ## OVERNIGHT PARKING

### **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING**

is in effect from **November 1st- April 1st**

from **2:00 a.m.- 5:00 a.m.** on all Borough streets.

If you need to park a vehicle on the street during these times, please call 732-747-0991, to be put on the overnight parking list for that night. If you need an extended period of time, please come to Police Headquarters Monday-Friday 9:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. and fill out a request for extended overnight parking. The police will be enforcing this Borough Ordinance so please follow the procedures.

## **Borough Code 14-6.1**

### **—Snow and Ice**

### **Removal Required; Time Limit.**

The owner, tenant or occupant of any building or lands abutting upon any street within the Borough of Fair Haven shall cause the sidewalk in front of the property to be cleared of snow or ice to a width of at least two (2) feet within twenty-four (24) hours after the cessation of the snowfall or formation of ice. In case of ice on the sidewalk, should it be impracticable to remove same, then the sidewalk shall be covered with sand or some other suitable substance so as to cause the sidewalk to be made safe and convenient for persons traveling thereon.

Remember not to leave your vehicles in the street if there is a chance that it may snow. Also, if you have a corner property, it is your responsibility to shovel the sidewalk in front of your residence and on the side.
