In the past eighteen months serving as your Mayor, considerable progress has been made on key and longstanding issues within the Borough. It was very rewarding to share much of that progress at the most recent Council Meeting held at Knollwood School. This annual meeting, named "The Marchese Meeting," gives eighth graders an opportunity to experience and participate in their local government. The enthusiasm of the youth of our town was evident and inspiring for all who attended.

Here are some key updates:

With the help of many community members, we have made terrific momentum on the new Police Department and Community Center, as well as the Department of Public Works renovation. In fact, we are optimistic that the groundbreaking will be this fall season. The public participation in the two Community Open House events was both substantial and impactful. Thank you to everyone who contributed their time to be there.

You may notice the hydroraking process underway at McCarter Pond. This process will help restore the pond so another generation of Fair Haven can continue to enjoy its splendor for years to come!

Changes to our fast-food ordinance language have been implemented after considerable thought and discussion over several years. Moreover, we are close to implementing changes on land-use laws in town, and are actively working on a new shade tree ordinance which will encourage planting more trees than are taken down. That process will start on Arbor Day, when close to 50 trees will be planted throughout the Borough to help ensure a tree canopy for our grandchildren.

We will soon begin the long-awaited micro projects all over the Borough, which will improve our infrastructure and roads. These projects underscore my commitment to continuously ensure Fair Haven remains a safe place to live.

Stay tuned for details about our "Love Where You Live" event on Sunday, May 7th from 1-4pm at Bicentennial Hall.

Finally, let's all celebrate the full return of Fair Haven Day on Saturday June 10th! I've enjoyed seeing many of you around town recently at various school and Borough events, as well as at our local business establishments. It's been such a pleasure to be your Mayor and I look forward to our continued partnership. **We are just getting started!**

Election News

The Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 6th. The deadline to register or change your name or address is no later than Tuesday, May 16th (21 days prior to the election); forms are available in my office or through the Borough's website (Forms and Documents, Clerk, NJ Voter Registration Application. If you are registered and are unable to vote at the polls, you may Vote by Mail. Please keep in mind there are procedures and timelines for this process.

The polling location <u>for all voting districts</u> is the Church of the Nativity, Parish Center, 180 Ridge Road. Your sample ballot that is mailed to you by the Monmouth County Clerk of Elections tells you what district you vote in.

The Monmouth County Board of Elections is in need of poll workers to assist with elections. Applications can be obtained through the Borough Clerk's office or through the Borough's website.

Large items may be placed at your curbside (i.e. mattress, couch, dining table, dresser). We **DO NOT** pick up construction debris (cabinets, sinks toilets, sheet rock, fencing, etc).

If you have an appliance (a stove, refrigerator, dishwasher, washer, dryer, hot water heater, air conditioner), you must come to the Administration Office and pay \$25.00 for each appliance that is being disposed.

If you have E-waste (computer, printer, TV, etc.), you must advise the Administration Office (732-747-0241, ext. *219). There is no fee to dispose of electronics.

10 Tips for Parents of New Drivers

Tip #1: Be the example your children need. If *you* refrain from using a cell phone while driving, buckle up your seat belt, respect others on the road and follow the traffic laws of your state, your teenager will follow your example.

Tip #2: Choose the appropriate car. A newer car may have better safety features and airbags than an older model. Larger cars offer more protection in a crash and your teen may be a bit less tempted to rev the engines for a race.

Tip #3: Practice makes a (nearly) perfect driver. No one becomes good at something after doing it for just a few hours. Your child needs at least two hours of practice driving each week for six months to reach a level of proficiency.



Tip #4: Limit nighttime driving. Reduced visibility at night makes nighttime driving much more challenging for inexperienced drivers.

Tip #5: Have the impaired driving talk. Talk with your child *before* he or she gets a license. If your teen were to consume *any* alcohol or other drugs before getting behind the wheel, they would be engaging in impaired driving. In addition to warning them about the risks of crashes and fatalities, make sure your child knows the legal and economic consequences of disobeying the law.

Tip #6: The dangers of texting. Hundreds of people die every month because a driver got distracted while behind the wheel. Teach your child to keep their eyes on the road and their minds focused.

Tip #7: Prepare them for the weather. Snow? Black ice? Heavy rains? Teach your child to know how to handle the common (and even uncommon!) situations that arise on the roads in your area.

Tip #8: Don't drive while drowsy. Fatigued drivers are dangerous drivers. Encourage your teen to balance their activities and get enough rest.

Tip #9: Keep an eye on maintenance. If your teenager knows how to test tire pressure, check essential fluids and change a flat tire, they'll be safer on the roadway.

Tip #10: Use technology to your advantage. Technology can allow you to monitor your teen's driving performance, to set speed alerts, radio volume limits, etc.

HOME SECURITY:

With the warmer weather approaching, many homeowners will begin to open their windows and sliding doors to allow the fresh air into their homes. An open window or slider, especially on the first floor, is an easily accessible entry point for any burglar looking for an "easy score". Remember to close and lock these windows and doors every time you leave your home. A burglar only needs a few minutes to enter your home and steal your valuables.
