



Dear Fair Haven Neighbors,

I hope that you and your family had a safe and joyful holiday season. On behalf of the Fair Haven Council, we would like to wish all residents and our extended community of staff members a happy and healthy new year.

2023 has been an unprecedented year of progress in the Borough. As the foundation was poured for the new Police Department, the gravity of this milestone was not lost on me. In redesigning the plans for the Police Department, Community Center, and Department of Public Works, the Borough of Fair Haven slashed approximately \$14 million dollars of costs that were previously considered for the projects. Within one calendar year, an extraordinary amount of work was put into the strategy, preparation, design, and delivery of this revised plan. We are extremely proud to have delivered on this priority for the Borough of Fair Haven.

Although the Facilities' initiative is the biggest project we embarked on in 2023, there are a variety of other projects underway to enhance the infrastructure and safety of our town. In November, we began the long-awaited hydroraking of McCarter Pond, which will continue in the spring. Also, we are on the precipice of delivering on a key directive in the Fair Haven Master Plan in the form of waterfront access for all. We will be delivering on a pocket park at the end of Grange Avenue as well as redoing the Municipal Small Water Craft Ramp at the end of Battin Road. Did someone say *finally finish Hance and Cooney this coming Spring?* Did I hear to *finally start the microprojects this Winter?* Done and done.

Perhaps most exciting, the Borough has entered an agreement to acquire land and riparian rights at the end of Fair Haven Road adjacent to our Municipal Dock. We look forward to working with all residents to design a park that will thoughtfully integrate into the neighborhood. We are committed to doing this the right way and are confident it will be something that our entire community will be proud of.

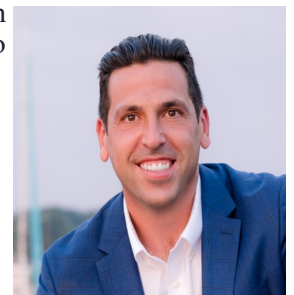
We recently updated our land-use ordinances to limit the envelope of new construction in town, we strengthened several ordinances to clean up our parks and improve overall quality of life, and our newly formed Brush and Leaf Committee made recommendations to improve services to our residents, which the Governing Body will implement in 2024. Also in 2024, we plan to pave Fair Haven Road from River Road to Ridge Road, implement a new Shade Tree Ordinance that is many years in the making, and continue important ADA upgrades and enhancements to Bicentennial Hall.

Recently, the Borough sent out a form looking for volunteers for our various Committees, Commissions, and Boards. I encourage you to get involved in any capacity you are comfortable. I would like to thank all of our volunteers – your commitment to making Fair Haven a better place to live does not go unnoticed and is very much appreciated by the entire community.

At the January 2nd Borough reorganization meeting, the Fair Haven governing body will welcome Brian Olson and Michal DiMiceli to Council. Please join me in congratulating them on their new roles! I look forward to continuing this journey with all of you.

**NO KNOCK**  
**NO KNOCK Registration Ordinance.** There is a **NO KNOCK Registration Ordinance** in effect which allows you to register with my office to be placed on a **NO KNOCK** list so solicitors will not approach your home, if you choose. When an applicant applies for such a license and if they are approved, they will be given a copy of the list (address only) of those who have registered. Hours have also been set for solicitation from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. Please keep in mind that there are organizations that are federally exempt from state and local regulations and can approach your home at hours other than what has been set. I will also be providing exempt organizations with the list of **NO KNOCK** registrants and ask for consideration. If you have already registered your property, you do not need to re-register.

**DON'T FORGET TO REGISTER YOUR PET!**  
 On behalf of the Dog Registrar, please remember to renew your dog and/or cat license. All dog and cat licenses expired on December 31, 2023. The 2024 licenses will be sold beginning **January 2, 2024.** A grace period will be granted until January 31, 2024; after that date, a \$5.00 penalty per month will be assessed. Rabies vaccinations must be renewed for 2024 if the vaccination expires prior to November 1, 2023.

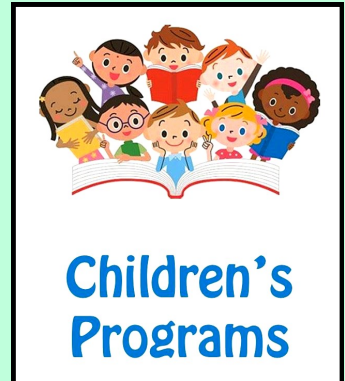

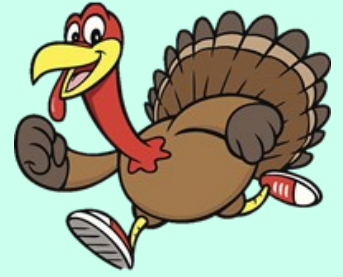

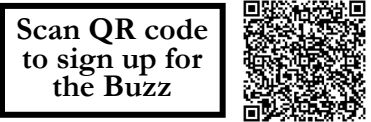

## Snow and Ice Removal

### from Vehicles and Sidewalks

#### **N.J.S.A. 39:4-77.1a – Failure to Remove Snow/Ice from Motor Vehicle**

Each driver of a motor vehicle, operated on a street or highway in this State, shall have an affirmative duty to make all reasonable efforts to remove accumulated ice or snow from exposed surfaces of the motor vehicle prior to operation. Surfaces shall include, but not be limited to, the hood, trunk, windshield, windows, roof of the motor vehicle, the cab of a truck, the top of a trailer or semitrailer being drawn by a motor vehicle and the top of an intermodal freight container being carried by an intermodal chassis. A person who violates the provisions of this subsection may be stopped on a street or highway by a law enforcement officer who believes the accumulated ice or snow may pose a threat to persons or property regardless of whether any snow or ice is dislodged from the motor vehicle.

## Special Needs Registry

In April 2016, the Monmouth County Special Needs Registry website began accepting new registrants. The goal of the registry is to ensure all Monmouth County residents who have special needs are able to get the help and support they need in a time of emergency or during interaction with Law Enforcement, Fire or EMS personnel. It is open to any person who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities due to a physical and/or intellectual disability. ## OVERNIGHT PARKING



### **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING**

is in effect from  
**November 1st- April 1st**  
from **2:00 a.m.- 5:00 a.m.** on all Borough streets.

If you need to park a vehicle on the street during these times, please call 732-747-0991, to be put on the overnight parking list for that night. If you need an extended period of time, please come to Police Headquarters Monday-Friday 9:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. and fill out a request for extended overnight parking. The police will be enforcing this Borough Ordinance so please follow the procedures.

### **Borough Code 14-6.1 —Snow and Ice Removal Required; Time Limit.**

The owner, tenant or occupant of any building or lands abutting upon any street within the Borough of Fair Haven shall cause the sidewalk in front of the property to be cleared of snow or ice to a width of at least two (2) feet within twenty-four (24) hours after the cessation of the snowfall or formation of ice. In case of ice on the sidewalk, should it be impracticable to remove same, then the sidewalk shall be covered with sand or some other suitable substance so as to cause the sidewalk to be made safe and convenient for persons traveling thereon.

Remember not to leave your vehicles in the street if there is a chance that it may snow. Also, if you have a corner property, it is your responsibility to shovel the sidewalk in front of your residence and on the side.
