



# FOCUS on FAIR HAVEN

*Dear Fair Haven Neighbors,*

I enjoy connecting with our community through the bi-monthly Focus sent out to our residents. Every other month I get the opportunity to update you on the latest and greatest around the Borough. This time, however, rather than reading my description of what's to come, you can see the progress right in front of your eyes. As we approach spring, we have tremendous momentum. We have broken ground on the new Police Department and Community Center buildings, and have begun renovating the Department of Public Works building. McCarter Pond has been partially hydro-raked and will be completed in the spring. Several microprojects are underway and drainage work has been completed. We continue to install new sidewalks and curbing to aid our safe routes to school and to help with storm drainage throughout the Borough. Additionally, we will be milling and paving Hance Road/Cooney Terrace, improving the Pocket Park on Grange Avenue, updating the municipal small craft ramp on Battin Road, and making Bicentennial Hall ADA compliant. Working with our utility partners, we also plan to pave all roads affected by gas and water main replacements upon completion of the concrete work at no cost to taxpayers.

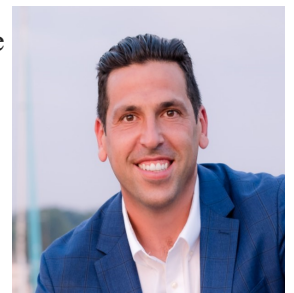
We continue our due diligence on the potential purchase of 21 Fair Haven Road and are cautiously optimistic about the potential to create a park that appropriately blends the fabric of our historic district with our Municipal Dock. We are still in the planning phase but are looking forward to completing road improvements on Fair Haven Road between River Road and Ridge Road.

We are rolling out a new Brush and Leaf Pickup program in 2024. We realize there will be some speed bumps and frustration as we begin a long overdue refresh of this service. As the new schedule begins, please provide feedback so we can pivot when necessary to ensure a positive impact on all residents. Finally, we are introducing a new tree ordinance with the goal of balancing the property rights of our residents with the overwhelming consensus that planting, preserving and maintaining trees is part of what makes Fair Haven such a special place to live.

Will you be joining the Foundation of Fair Haven for the Haven Hoe Down on March 2nd? Will we see you at Fair Haven Day on June 8th as we dance, eat, and light up the sky again? Will we see you on May 25th on Willow Street for our first monthly Farmers Market? What about the Fishing Derby? Town Wide Yard Sale? Easter Egg Hunt? Daddy/Daughter Dance or Mother/Son Dance?

The journey continues. Let's enjoy it together as one community.

I also want to encourage our senior citizen population, particularly those who live alone, to register for the Fair Haven Police Department's Well Being Check Program. This program has been ongoing for years and it has been very successful. Registered seniors are contacted and/or visited weekly by a Fair Haven Police Officer. Additionally, registered seniors are contacted during weather events or other emergencies, which gives both the senior citizen and their family members some additional peace of mind knowing that they are being checked on by Fair Haven's finest. 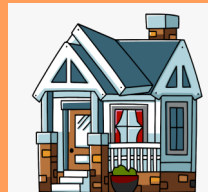

**Bulk Pick-Up** - Bulk pick-ups occur January through October; they are the first Monday of the month for Trash Zones 1 and 2 and the second Monday of the month for Trash Zones 3 and 4. The items must be large (i.e. mattress, couch, dining table, dresser). We **do not** pick up construction debris (cabinets, sinks toilets, sheet rock, fencing, etc.). If you have an appliance (a stove, refrigerator, dishwasher, washer, dryer, hot water heater, air conditioner), you must come to the Administration Office and pay \$25.00 for each appliance you are disposing of. If you have E-waste (computer, printer, TV, etc.), you must advise the Administration Office (732-747-0241, ext. \*219).

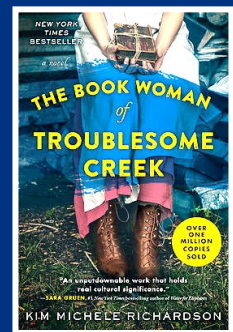

Together we raised \$115,000 dollars to help reduce poverty and hunger in our local communities and around our world.

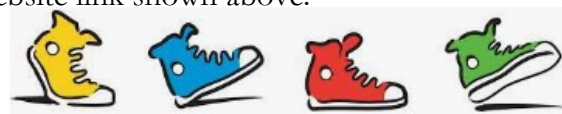


Almost \$29,000 and the thousands of pounds of food have been shared among our local partners:

# Fair Haven Police Department



## TAX SEASON PHONE SCAMS

Tax season is upon us. Inevitably, this means that phone scammers and/or email scammers will be upon us as well. There are several things you can do to prevent yourself from becoming their next victim.

1. First and foremost, the IRS **does not** make phone calls or send email. If they need to contact you, they will contact you via postal mail only.
2. If you happen to receive a call from someone claiming to represent the IRS, it is recommended to not engage in conversation and immediately hang up the phone.
3. **Never** provide any personal information such as your legal name, birth date, social security number, bank account information, etc.
4. Do not open email from senders you are unfamiliar with. If you do open an email in error, do not click on any links or provide any of the personal information described above.

This is a very lucrative business so these types of scams will continue. Educating our residents is the best defense we have against them as prosecution is highly unlikely. *Don't become their next victim!*

Remember not to leave your vehicles in the street if there is a chance that it may snow. Also, after any snow fall, it is your responsibility to shovel the sidewalk in front of your residence and on the side, if you have a corner property.
