Fair Haven – Please see this week's updates:

I would like to take this moment to reflect on the history of our town. As you may well know Fair Haven has a fascinating history.

In the 1790s, Samuel Still, likely a free black man, formed a community on his 25 acres of land on the eastern end of Fair Haven. In 1842 and 1850 he donated some of his land for an A.M.E. Church and a school for African American students. Browns Lane, fondly known today as the "oldest street" in Fair Haven, was named after Still's son-in-law Jacob Brown. To learn more about Fair Haven's history, take a read through this article from several years ago at our bicentennial celebration.
