*I hope that you and your family had a safe and joyful holiday season. On behalf of the Fair Haven Council and Borough Staff, we would like to wish everyone a happy and healthy New Year.*

*Since being sworn in on October 13th, I have had the opportunity to get to know many of the residents, business owners, and professionals that make Fair Haven such a special place to live. If we haven't had the chance to meet personally yet, I look forward to doing so in 2022.*

*As we reflect on 2021, many of the challenges we faced with the COVID-19 pandemic continued to impact the way we lived and worked. However, a sense of normalcy returned as we moved through the months, which was a welcomed change from the prior year. Our kids are back in school full time, our restaurants are open to full capacity, and, in many ways, life as we know it has resumed.*

*The Borough of Fair Haven had a tremendous year, with substantial improvements to Battin Road, Harrison Avenue and Willow Street. We saw the installation of a turf field at McCarter Park, and the construction and completion of additions to both Sickles and Knollwood Schools. This summer we also saw the return of the Fireman's Fair, an important tradition that connects so many generations of Fair Haven residents and visitors.*

*There is much to look forward to in 2022. We are gearing up for the construction of the new Department of Public Works and Police Department facilities at their existing locations, as well as additional work on historic Bicentennial Hall. We recently approved a contract for improvements to Hance Road and Cooney Terrace, for which the vast majority of costs will be covered by an NJDOT Grant. We also approved the design of various micro-projects for Buttonwood Drive, DeNormandie Avenue, the Gentry, Hunting Lane, Laurel Drive, Lewis Lane, Linden Drive, Oaklawn Road, Park Lane, Ridge Road, and the Fair Haven Road Historic District. Moreover, we are reviewing Borough ordinances as they relate to land use and our tree canopy.*

*At the January 3<sup>rd</sup> Borough Reorganization Meeting, the Fair Haven Governing Body will welcome Tracy Cole to Council as well as re-elected Councilwoman Betsy Koch. Congratulations, ladies!*

*I look forward to continuing this journey with all of you.*



On behalf of the Dog Registrar, please remember to renew your dog and/or cat license. All dog and cat licenses expired on December 31, 2021. The 2022 licenses will be sold beginning January 3, 2022. A grace period will be granted until January 31, 2022; after that date, a \$5.00 penalty per month will be assessed. Rabies vaccinations must be renewed for 2022 if the vaccination expires prior to November 1, 2022.

#### NO KNOCK REGISTRATION ORDINANCE.

There is a NO KNOCK Registration Ordinance in effect which allows you to register with my office to be placed on a NO KNOCK list so solicitors will not approach your home, if you choose. When a solicitor applies for such a license and if they are approved, they will be given a copy of the list (address only) of those who have registered. Hours have also been set for solicitation from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. Please keep in mind that there are organizations that are federally exempt from state and local regulations and can approach your home at hours other than what has been set. I will also be providing exempt organizations with the list of NO KNOCK registrants and ask for consideration. If you have already registered your property, you do not need to re-register.



## BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR—LOOKING FOR ADULT VOLUNTEERS!

The Good Neighbor Snow Shoveling Program is a cooperative effort between Knollwood School, the students and volunteer community members. Seniors currently on our list have been mailed a renewal form.

## Snow and Ice Removal from Vehicles and Sidewalks

### **N.J.S.A. 39:4-77.1a – Failure to Remove Snow/Ice from Motor Vehicle**

Each driver of a motor vehicle, operated on a street or highway in this State, shall have an affirmative duty to make all reasonable efforts to remove accumulated ice or snow from exposed surfaces of the motor vehicle prior to operation. Surfaces shall include, but not be limited to, the hood, trunk, windshield, windows, roof of the motor vehicle, the cab of a truck, the top of a trailer or semitrailer being drawn by a motor vehicle and the top of an intermodal freight container being carried by an intermodal chassis. A person who violates the provisions of this subsection may be stopped on a street or highway by a law enforcement officer who believes the accumulated ice or snow may pose a threat to persons or property regardless of whether any snow or ice is dislodged from the motor vehicle.

## Special Needs Registry

In April 2016, the Monmouth County Special Needs Registry website began accepting new registrants. The goal of the registry is to ensure all Monmouth County residents who have special needs are able to get the help and support they need in a time of emergency or during interaction with Law Enforcement, Fire or EMS personnel. It is open to any person who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities due to a physical and/or intellectual disability. ## OVERNIGHT PARKING

### **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING**

is in effect from **November 1st- April 1st** from **2:00 a.m.- 5:00 a.m.** on all Borough streets.



If you need to park a vehicle on the street during these times, please call 732-747-0991, to be put on the overnight parking list for that night. If you need an extended period of time, please come to Police Headquarters Monday-Friday 9:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. and fill out a request for extended overnight parking. The police will be enforcing this Borough Ordinance so please follow the procedures.

## **Borough Code 14-6.1 —Snow and Ice Removal Required; Time Limit.**

The owner, tenant or occupant of any building or lands abutting upon any street within the Borough of Fair Haven shall cause the sidewalk in front of the property to be cleared of snow or ice to a width of at least two (2) feet within twenty-four (24) hours after the cessation of the snowfall or formation of ice. In case of ice on the sidewalk, should it be impracticable to remove same, then the sidewalk shall be covered with sand or some other suitable substance so as to cause the sidewalk to be made safe and convenient for persons traveling thereon.

Remember not to leave your vehicles in the street if there is a chance that it may snow. Also, if you have a corner property, it is your responsibility to shovel the sidewalk in front of your residence and on the side.
