





## As a little FYI:



# Bulk Pick-Up (January to October)

Bulk pick-ups are done the first Monday of the month for Trash Zones 1 and 2 and the second Monday of the month for Trash Zones 3 and 4. The items must be large (i.e. mattress, couch, dining table, dresser). We **do not** pick up construction debris (cabinets, sinks toilets, sheet rock, etc).

If you have an appliance (a stove, refrigerator, dishwasher, washer, dryer, hot water heater, air conditioner), you must come to the Administration Office and pay \$15.00 for each appliance you are disposing of. If you have E-waste (computer, printer, TV, etc.), you must advise the Administration Office (732-747-0241, ext. \*219).


To note: The Father/Daughter Dance and Mother/Son Dance will be postponed. We hope to be able to offer these events later in 2021.

# Mandated Recyclables & Sorting



#### Glass Bottles & Jars

Food and beverage bottles and jars are acceptable.

- DO NOT INCLUDE: ceramics, dishes, glassware, lightbulbs, windows
- DO NOT INCLUDE: caps or lids



#### Metal Cans

Aluminum cans, Tin cans and Bimetal cans (*tin cans with aluminum lids*) are all accepted. Please rinse.

Non-hazardous aerosol cans are also accepted. Empty please.

 DO NOT INCLUDE: aluminum foil, plates, trays or cookware or any metal scrap

Sorting plastic helps produce high-quality recycled products. Manufacturers print a standard

code (#1-7) on the bottom of every container. ONLY recycle Types #1 and 2 with a "pourable' neck smaller than the body. No. 1 Polyethylene Teraphthalate PET, PETE Soft drink, water, soda bottles or No. 2 High Density Polyethylene Detergent bottles

DO NOT INCLUDE: plastic bags, margarine tubs, diaper wipes containers, yogurt cups, dear salad containers, food storage containers



#### LEAVES & GRASS CLIPPINGS

Most towns collect unbagged leaves in the fall and spring. Grass clippings can be left on the lawn, added to compost or brought to drop off at County Reclamation

Center (landfill) for a fee.

DO NOT THROW LEAVES OR GRASS IN THE TRASH



# TAX SEASON PHONE SCAMS

Tax season is upon us. Inevitably, this means that phone scammers and/or email scammers will be upon us as well. There are several things you can do to prevent yourself from becoming their next victim.

1. First and foremost, the IRS <u>does not</u> make phone calls or send email. If they need to contact you, they will contact you via postal mail only.

2. If you happen to receive a call from someone claiming to represent the IRS, it is recommended to not engage in conversation and immediately hang up the phone.

3. <u>Never</u> provide any personal information such as your legal name, birth date, social security number, bank account information, etc.

4. Do not open email from senders you are unfamiliar with. If you do open an email in error, do not click on any links or provide any of the personal information described above.

This is a very lucrative business so these types of scams will continue. Educating our residents is the best defense we have against them as prosecution is highly unlikely. *Don't become their next victim!* 

## **BOROUGH ORDINANCES**

Remember not to leave your vehicles in the street if there is a chance that it may snow. Also, after any snow fall, it is your responsibility to shovel the sidewalk in front of your residence and on the side, if you have a corner property.

**OVERNIGHT PARKING** is in effect from November 1st-April 1st from 2:00 a.m.-5:00 a.m. on all Borough streets. If you need to park a vehicle in the street during these times, please call 732-747-0991, to be put on the overnight parking list for that night. If you need an extended period of time, please come Police Headquarters, 35 Fisk Street, Monday-Friday 9:30 a.m.—2:30 p.m. and fill out a request for extended overnight parking. The police will be enforcing this Borough Ordinance so please follow the procedures.

#### SIGN ORDINANCE for Contractors Conducting Work in Fair Haven

#### \* PLEASE BE ADVISED\*

---CHAPTER 30, SECTION 7.24, Subsections c 6 and 14 do <u>NOT</u> allow for business advertisement signs on a lawn or fence where work is being done.

#### Cell Phone Reminder . . .

... that all drivers are not permitted to talk, check voicemail, text, read texts, play games, etc. on their cell phones or operate any other devices while driving. Drivers are permitted to use a hands free device to talk only via cell
