

Most of you are aware that throughout Monmouth County there have been a number of vehicle thefts. Unfortunately, these thefts have also been occurring in Fair Haven. All the vehicles stolen were either left running unattended or were left unlocked with the key fob inside.

Vehicle thefts are occurring on any day of the week and at any time of day. We have been extremely lucky that these thefts have not resulted



in anyone getting hurt. However, we need to do everything we can to stop these thefts before someone does. As Chief of Police, I am asking that you please lock your car doors at all times, remove the key fobs from your vehicle and to never leave your car running unattended.

Our Department has been working with other local police departments and with state officials to combat these thefts. Patrols are on constant alert and we continue to ask for your cooperation in reporting any suspicious activity immediately. If we all work together, we can eliminate these thefts

from occurring.


Dear Fair Haven Neighbors,

BULK PICK-UP (JANUARY TO OCTOBER)

Bulk pick-ups are done the first Monday of the month for Trash Zones 1 and 2 and the second Monday of the month for Trash Zones 3 and 4. The items must be large (i.e. mattress, couch, dining table, dresser). We **do not** pick up construction debris (cabinets, sinks toilets, sheet rock, fencing, etc). If you have an appliance (a stove, refrigerator, dishwasher, washer, dryer, hot water heater, air conditioner), you must come to the Administra-

tion Office and pay \$15.00 for each appliance you are disposing of. If you have E-waste (computer, printer, TV, etc.), you must advise the Administration Office (732-747-0241, ext. *219).

IMPORTANT BRUSH AND/OR LEAF PICK UP FACTS:

-APRIL STARTS LEAF & BRUSH COLLECTION-

- It is very important that residents put brush and/or leaves to the curb no later than the weekend prior to your designated zone's pick up week.
- Please note that the DPW will pick up brush and leaves only one time on your street, for each designated week. As such, it is essential that you have your brush and/or leaves to the curb no later than the Sunday night of your respective pick-up weeks.
- The DPW crew only does one pass on each street during your pick-up week. Once they pick up on your street, they will not return anytime later that week.
- If you miss the pick-up day on your street, or if you have additional brush and/or leaves after your street has been picked up, please keep the brush and/or leaves on your property, as opposed to in the street, until the weekend before your next designated pick-up week.
- All Landscapers are required to register annually with the Borough, at which time they are given a copy of our zone brush and leaf pick-up schedule to follow. Please speak to your landscaper and reinforce the need to follow the zone pick up schedule

ONLY RAIN DOWN THE STORM DRAIN

After rain falls on roofs, streets and lawns, it picks up all kinds of contaminants as it flows untreated into our storm drains. Pollutants can wind up in our creeks and rivers. We all need to do our part to make sure only rain goes down the storm drains!!



LEASHING YOUR DOG



Any dog off the premises of the person owning, keeping or harboring it shall be accompanied by a person who is capable of controlling it and who has the dog securely confined and controlled by an adequate **leash** not more than six feet long. TAX SEASON PHONE SCAMS

Tax season is upon us. Inevitably, this means that phone scammers and/or email scammers will be upon us as well. There are several things you can do to prevent yourself from becoming their next victim.

- 1. First and foremost, the IRS <u>does not</u> make phone calls or send email. If they need to contact you, they will contact you via postal mail only.
- 2. If you happen to receive a call from someone claiming to represent the IRS, it is recommended to not engage in conversation and immediately hang up the phone.
- 3. <u>Never</u> provide any personal information such as your legal name, birth date, social security number, bank account information, etc.
- 4. Do not open email from senders you are unfamiliar with. If you do open an email in error, do not click on any links or provide any of the personal information described above.

This is a very lucrative business so these types of scams will continue. Educating our residents is the best defense we have against them as prosecution is highly unlikely. *Don't become their next victim!*

BOROUGH ORDINANCES

Remember not to leave your vehicles in the street if there is a chance that it may snow. Also, after any snow fall, it is your responsibility to shovel the sidewalk in front of your residence and on the side, if you have a corner property.

Cell Phone Reminder . . .

...that all drivers are not permitted to talk, check voicemail, text, read texts, play games, etc. on their cell phones or operate any other devices while driving. Drivers are permitted to use a hands free device to talk only via cell phones while driving.
