

Dear Fair Haven Neighbors,

It's autumn in Fair Haven! The leaves are starting to change color and pumpkins adorn our front porches. Apple cider donuts and hot chocolate have replaced lemonade stands, and campers are students again. I hope you are all enjoying the energy of our athletic competitions that has filled our town with the sounds of cheering parents and friends. This is the beautiful life we live, year in and year out, and one of many reasons we all choose to be a part of this community.

There is one new thing that is certainly noticeable this fall: shovels are in the ground. After many years of healthy debate and design, construction has begun on our Police Department and Community Center buildings on Fisk Street. Once complete, our Department of Public Works building on Allen Street will be renovated. When all is said and done, I am proud to say that we were able to rein in spending by approximately \$10 million in cost to our taxpayers by changing prior design plans of these two buildings.

We are going to have a busy end to 2023. We will start by completing the Hance Road project. We plan to hydro-rake McCarter Pond, complete the pocket park on Grange Avenue and the municipal small craft ramp on Battin Road. We will also be replacing broken light posts on River Road while standardizing the bulbs used to light up our main corridor. We have more than 40 micro-projects underway, including new sidewalks on Harding Road and sidewalk improvements in the Historic District on Fair Haven Road and in the Gentry. We have also started addressing stormwater management and drainage in multiple locations addressing longstanding issues. We have partnered with our utilities to update their delivery equipment to many homes across the Borough. This work will also result in curb to curb restoration due to our recently approved ordinance that ensures full pavement of our roads after such repairs.

Other updates... We are close to making improvements at one of our crown jewels, Bicentennial Hall. Recently, the Historic Association hosted a well-attended Garden Party to raise substantial funds in support of this restoration effort. We are implementing new brush and leaf pickup standards, as recommended by our Brush and Leaf Committee. We are thoughtfully contemplating an acquisition of land adjacent to our municipal dock that will serve to provide additional river access to the Navesink for generations to come.

As we move closer to 2024, I always like to reflect on the past and savor the present. We have experienced so much together as a community. I am so proud to have earned the chance to represent you as your Mayor, and as I pass the two year mark in this role I hope that you all feel that I am fulfilling the promises I made to the community. If you have any feedback or feel we can improve in any way, please reach out to me.

Please join us in honoring our Veterans on November 11th. Let's be thankful for the sacrifices they made for us. When you sit down with friends and family for Thanksgiving on November 23rd, I ask that you take a moment to be thankful for the Fair Haven community. Be thankful for one another. Be thankful for our volunteers. Be thankful for your health. Be thankful.

The holiday lights will soon shine throughout our Borough, and Fair Haven's future is equally bright. We are just getting started and I look forward to all of the progress that we can make together in 2024. I am thankful to be your Mayor.

From our Borough Administrator

Dear Fair Haven Residents,

On October 10th, I was honored to participate in the groundbreaking ceremony for the Borough's new Police Department (FHPD) and Community Center (CC) buildings. This was a long awaited milestone for the Borough, which was the result of many years of study, hard work and collaboration. Below is an edited version of a letter that was recently disseminated to provide important information on the Borough's new facility projects.

- 1. The FHPD and CC project was awarded to Hall Construction and that entire parcel is now an active construction site. Fences have been erected around the site to ensure proper safety protocols and there will be no access to or from, the park through that site. The current CC will be closed for the duration of the project to ensure the utmost safety of our residents. The Borough has identified and secured contingency meeting locations, to include Council Chambers, Bicentennial Hall, Knights of Columbus, Church of the Nativity and Board of Education spaces.
- 2. The DPW project, slated to take 12 months to complete, is currently in the bidding phase, with an anticipated award date in November. For safety and to allow for site improvements, the Recycling Center will be closed for the duration of the project. The DPW team will work out of the Fair Haven Fields Concession Stand location, utilizing 13 parking spaces closest to the exit at Dartmouth Avenue. The fence at DPW will remain until the site itself is reduced and a new fence is erected.

We recognize the proximity of all three of these projects to Third Street and we will work closely with all contractors to ensure the safety of pedestrians and bicyclists. To further guard against the unexpected, we will implement additional monitors and patrols to ensure site safety, mitigate impacts to residents, and control deliveries of construction materials. Additionally, we are requesting support from our community in the form of the following:

• Please take time to educate our youngest family members regarding site safety. Please avoid the construction sites and follow proper bicycle and pedestrian safety protocols, by following traffic laws on the roadways and walking on sidewalks wherever available.

• Maximize use of your blue single stream recycling can to its fullest every week for all your cans, bottles, and broken down cardboard.

• If you haven't already done so, please sign up for The Buzz (QR code provided). This will allow the Borough staff to provide you with the latest updates, especially when it may impact the circulation of cars, pedestrians, and bicycles.

Shade Tree Commission's 1st Resident Tree Buying Program



The Shade Tree Commission (STC) successfully launched a Resident Tree Buying Program in August. In a partnership with Fernbrook Nursery, located in Bordentown, the program gave Fair Haven residents the opportunity to purchase locally grown trees directly from Fernbrook at a negotiated price. The offering included a variety of shade trees, flowering trees, and evergreens. The price included professional planting by Fernbrook and a one-year tree guarantee.

The STC was thrilled with the results of this inaugural program. Residents chose a wide variety of trees, one of the most popular being the Fair Haven Road "favorite" Kwanzan Cherry Tree. Many Northeast native trees were also ordered including other popular picks, the American Holly and Sweetbay Magnolia. All in all, 56 trees were ordered, and the planting took place over 2 rainy days in late September.

Trees are an important part of Fair Haven's identity and a valued resource to residents. Trees have known physical and mental health benefits, increase property values, and have a significant environmental impact. The STC's mission is to protect, preserve and expand the tree canopy in the Borough. This program has allowed us to advance our mission while giving residents an opportunity to add natural beauty and value to their property, a win -win for all!

Look for the next Resident Tree Buying Program to open in Spring 2024.

- Animal waste adds nitrogen to the water. Excess nitrogen depletes the oxygen in water necessary for beneficial underwater grasses, wildlife and fish.
- No one likes to step in pet waste and spread it into homes, cars and businesses.
- Please DO NOT place your pet's waste in random trash cans.
- Your neighbors will appreciate your good manners.

PET WASTE AND WATER POLLUTION

Pet waste is carried by rain, melting snow, and ice to storm drains that empty into rivers, lakes, and the ocean. It also reaches reservoirs which supply much of the drinking water in New Jersey.

Pollution due to pet waste negatively impacts swimming, boating and fishing in these water bodies. Pet waste contains microorganisms that can cause bacterial diseases, roundworms and parasitic infections.

In addition, pet waste contains harmful levels of nutrients which promote excessive algae and plant growth. This can rob the waterbody of oxygen, potentially killing all aquatic life in the area. Such nutrient pollution also causes waters to become cloudy and green.

FAIR HAVEN SCHOOL DISTRICT PRESCHOOL PROGRAM



The Fair Haven School District offers an Integrated Preschool Program. This program is a combination of general education and special education students.

Program Criteria: Due to limited space, tuition-in general education students are selected for the program via a lottery system. To be eligible for the lottery children must be at least 3 years of age by September 1, 2024 but will not yet reach the age of 5 by October 1, 2024. The cost for tuition is \$4000 for the year.

Program Details: The Integrated Preschool program follows the NJ Preschool Teaching and Learning Expectations and is taught by a dual certified P-3 teacher. The program offers morning and afternoon sessions, 5 days a week, and follows the Fair Haven Public Schools regular school year calendar. The session times are as follows: AM (8:30 am-10:50 am) PM (12:50pm-3:10 pm). If accepted, your child will be assigned a slot based on space, availability, and an appropriate balance of classes.

Lottery Dates: The lottery to select children to fill the available slots will close on December 1, 2023 . Should your child be selected, you will be notified on or about December 10, 2023. You will be provided with more information at that time, including which session (AM or PM) your child has been assigned to.

Please complete the <u>Preschool Lottery Interest Form</u> by December 1, 2023 to have your child included in the lottery process. You can also find the Lottery Interest Form on the Sickles School website in the Special Services tab under About Our School.

HOLIDAY SHOPPING Safety Tips


- Always park in a well-lit and well-traveled area.
