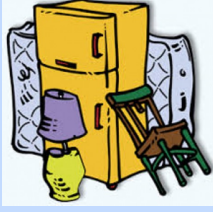

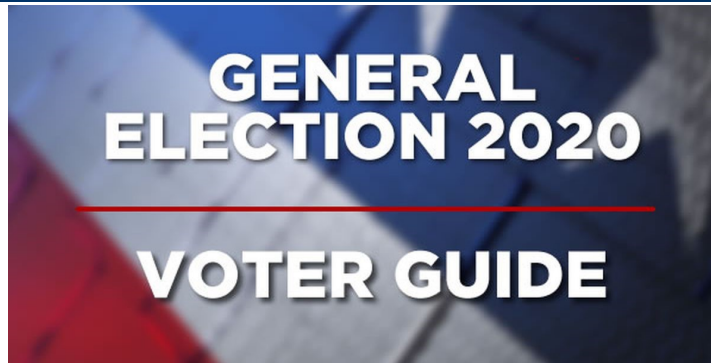

Please keep in mind that the General Election is Tuesday, November 3, 2020 and will be conducted primarily by Mail-In Ballot in New Jersey. Your Mail-In Ballot can be returned via mail to the County (must be postmarked no later than November 3rd), you can bring it to the polling location on Election Day (you must sign the poll book and the poll worker will place your voted ballot in the locked ballot bag to be turned in to my office at the end of the night for delivery to the County) or you can drop it in one of the locked Ballot Boxes located throughout Monmouth County (locations listed below):

ROAD CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Dear Fair Haven Residents:

Over the next six months there will be a good deal of roadway construction in and around Fair Haven’s River Road corridor.

A general overview of each project, as follows:

BATTIN ROAD PROJECT:
 The Borough is installing limited sidewalks and milling and paving all of Battin Road. Pending NJDOT approval, we will also be connecting that work to prior work that was previously completed in the Lewis Point Road neighborhood. These projects will give that area of town safe pedestrian routes from Battin Road to Hance Road, which will also improve safe access to both our elementary schools. This project has already begun, and it will be fully funded by an NJDOT grant, in the

NEW CURBS AND SIDEWALKS:
 In preparation for the upcoming paving of River Road, the Borough will be installing new curbs and sidewalks on River Road, from Smith Street west to the Red Bank border. This is the last phase of a complete streetscape for the entire length of River Road, within Fair Haven. This sidewalk connectivity provides safe pedestrian access from our neighborhoods both to and throughout our downtown. This project will begin in the next few weeks and it is being fully funded by Fair Haven, as part of our ongoing capital improvement plan.

MONMOUTH COUNTY ROAD PROJECT—RIVER ROAD
 The Mayor and Council have also petitioned the County to reduce the speed limit to 25 MPH, for the entire length of River Road. Monmouth County will be milling and paving the entire length of River Road within Fair Haven. This project is being fully funded by Monmouth County, except for the installation of bike lanes on River Road, the cost of which will be shared by the County and the Borough of Fair Haven. Bike lanes in this area of town are part of the Borough’s adopted Active Transportation Plan and the completion of this project will increase and improve safe pedestrian access routes for bicycle riders.

This County paving project will begin in the early spring. The full design and the project oversight for the Battin Road Project, the River Road Streetscape Project, and the River Road Bicycle Lane Project, will be handled by The Borough of Fair Haven’s Department of Engineering, under the direction of Borough Engineer, Rich Gardella. The use of in-house engineering for these three projects will save the Borough nearly \$300,000.00 in outside engineering consulting fees.

I realize that these various projects will constitute a good deal of roadway construction, in a limited time frame, through a well-traveled area of town, in and around our school access routes. As is often the case, it is most fiscally and practically prudent to also complete utility and road projects that will be intersecting with another major road improvement project. I want to assure the residents of Fair Haven that Chief McGovern will be overseeing a very active police traffic management plan, which will insure pedestrian safety, as well as, our resident’s access to their homes and our business district, for the duration of all projects.

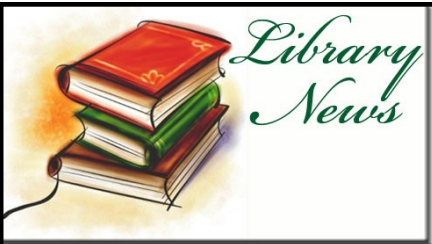

FAIR HAVEN SCHOOL DISTRICT PRESCHOOL PROGRAM



The Fair Haven School District will be offering an Integrated Preschool Program for the 2021-2022 school year. The integrated preschool program combines students with and without special needs. Children must be 3 years of age by July 15, 2021. If your child is of kindergarten age by October 15, 2021, your child is not eligible.

This program follows the NJ State Department of Education's Preschool Teaching and Learning Expectations, Standards of Quality and taught by a certified teacher. Typically developing children, as well as, children with special needs, will be included in the program.

There are two preschool sections, morning and afternoon. The classes will meet 5 days a week for 2 hours and 20 minutes per day. The preschool program will follow the Fair Haven School District's 2021-2022 academic calendar.

Space is limited; a lottery will be conducted in January to select the children to fill the available slots.

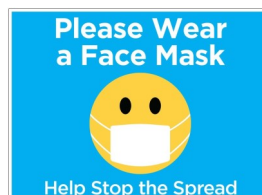

ROAD CLOSURE REMINDER

During school days, the length of Third Street will be closed to ALL vehicular traffic between the hours of 7:30-8:45am and 2:30-3:45pm. The ONLY exceptions will be for those who reside on Third St or an adjoining street (Church St, Maple Ave, Allen St, Williams St, Cedar Ave, Country Ln). We kindly ask that these residents use the roads closest to their homes to enter/exit Third St. DO NOT enter/exit Third St from either Fair Haven Rd or Hance Rd where the crossing guards are posted during these times and barricades are erected. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and understanding.

PLAN BEFORE A FIRE

If a fire starts in your home, you may have as little as three minutes to escape. To be sure you and your family members get out quickly and safely, start planning and practicing your escape now!

Begin with a simple map of your home to plan two ways out of each room. Don't forget to identify a meeting place outside the front of your home. Next, practice your plan with a home fire drill. Push the test button on a smoke alarm and have everyone exit to your meeting place. School-age children should be encouraged to escape unaided in the event you can't help them. Finally, talk about how your drill went. Identify ways to improve and make a goal to have at least two a year, including one at night.



SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL – Borough Ordinances



14-6.1 Removal Required; Time Limit.

The owner, tenant or occupant of any building or lands abutting upon any street within the Borough of Fair Haven shall cause the sidewalk in front of the property to be cleared of snow or ice to a width of at least two (2) feet within twenty-four (24) hours after the cessation of the snowfall or formation of ice. In case of ice on the sidewalk, should it be impracticable to remove same, then the sidewalk shall be covered with sand or some other suitable substance so as to cause the sidewalk to be made safe and convenient for persons traveling thereon.

14-6.2 Deposit of Snow or Ice on Plowed Streets Prohibited.

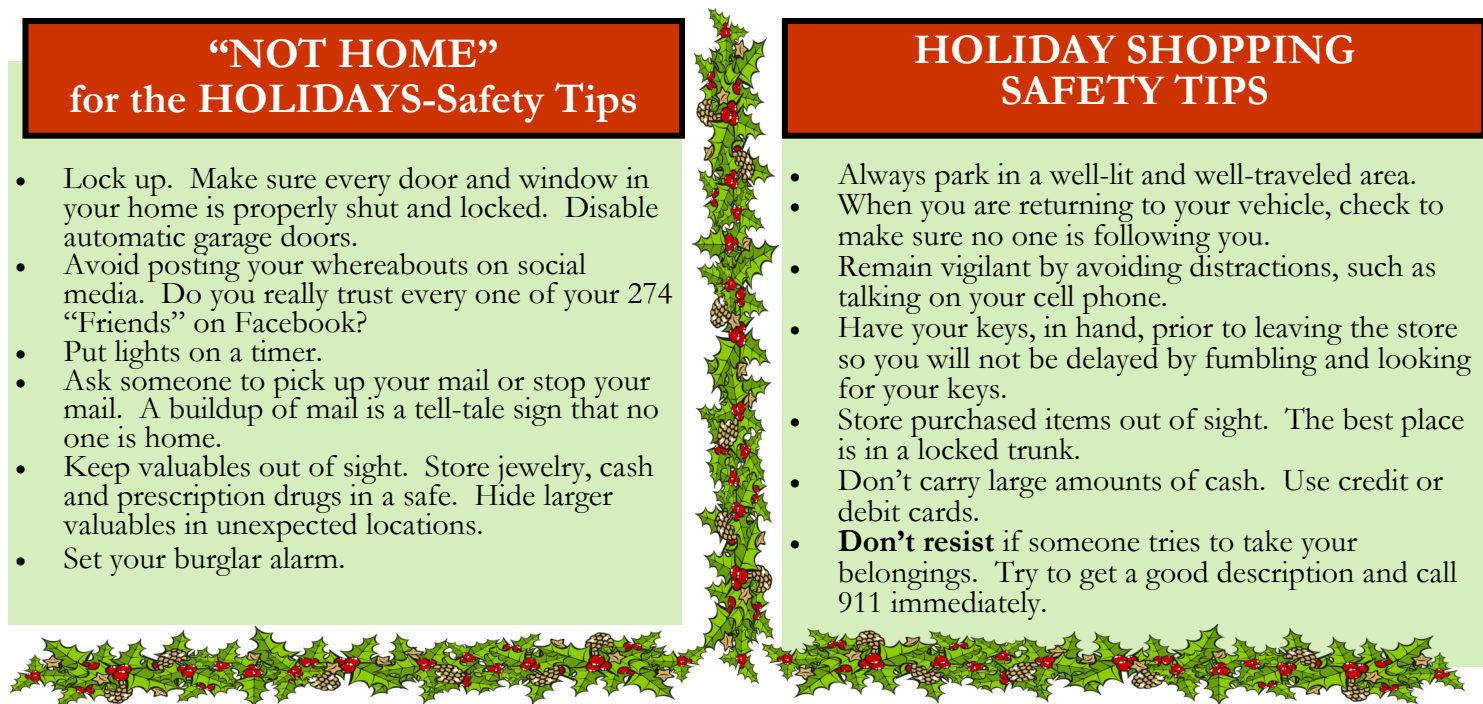
No person shall sweep, throw or deposit any snow or ice in that part of the street which has been or is being plowed, swept, cleaned or cleared by the municipality for the passage of traffic.

“NOT HOME” for the HOLIDAYS-Safety Tips

- Lock up. Make sure every door and window in your home is properly shut and locked. Disable automatic garage doors.
- Avoid posting your whereabouts on social media. Do you really trust every one of your 274 “Friends” on Facebook?
- Put lights on a timer.
- Ask someone to pick up your mail or stop your mail. A buildup of mail is a tell-tale sign that no one is home.
- Keep valuables out of sight. Store jewelry, cash and prescription drugs in a safe. Hide larger valuables in unexpected locations.
- Set your burglar alarm.

HOLIDAY SHOPPING SAFETY TIPS

- Always park in a well-lit and well-traveled area.
- When you are returning to your vehicle, check to make sure no one is following you.
- Remain vigilant by avoiding distractions, such as talking on your cell phone.
- Have your keys, in hand, prior to leaving the store so you will not be delayed by fumbling and looking for your keys.
- Store purchased items out of sight. The best place is in a locked trunk.
- Don't carry large amounts of cash. Use credit or debit cards.
- **Don't resist** if someone tries to take your belongings. Try to get a good description and call 911 immediately.
