



Dear Fair Haven Neighbors,

For the past two years, the Council, Borough staff, community volunteers and I have been working together to achieve the objectives of our Master Plan. We are now starting to see the fruits of that labor in the form of shovels in the ground, asphalt being poured, infrastructure being renewed and updated, and much needed improvements to drainage and stormwater throughout the Borough. Your tax dollars are hard at work throughout Fair Haven. Fiscally responsible projects are enhancing the quality of our lives and the place we choose to call home.

We are working on over forty road projects, new construction and/or improvements to five Borough buildings, improvements to our waterways and pocket parks, as well as repairing the street lamps on River Road. In addition to these physical improvements, we have also made improvements to our ordinances, seeking to improve the quality of life for all Fair Haven residents. After consultation with our Brush and Leaf Committee, we will be rolling out a new brush and leaf schedule. We made changes to our land use laws to limit the envelopes of new construction. We established and continue to consider new ordinances designed to limit nuisances in your daily lives while enriching our community.

As we enter into the autumn season, our tree-lined streets will begin to give us a show of colors straight out of a Robert Frost poem. If you would like to add a new tree to your property, I'd encourage you to look into our Shade Tree Commission's Resident Tree Buying Program. Just make a payment and you will have a new tree planted on your property without even lifting a finger!

I hope you share my appreciation for the additional crosswalks and stop signs on Third Street, one of our most important passageways. Our commitment to pedestrian and bicycle safety within the Borough is unwavering. As the school year starts, please remind your children and teenagers of the importance of wearing helmets and crossing at crosswalks. Put the phones down when driving, biking or walking. Let's educate our youth about the importance of making safe choices to keep themselves and others out of harm's way.

Our children will return to school with precious memories of the summer of 2023. Maybe they surfed a radical wave or had a great day at Fair Haven Rec camp. Maybe they biked up a newly paved Third Street to meet up with friends for a bite at one of Fair Haven's establishments. Maybe they won a stuffed animal at the Frog Bog or took a wild ride on the Zipper before a visit to the Outback. Maybe they enjoyed a BBQ in the backyard or Wednesdays on the Water at our dock with family and friends. Our youth will carry these core memories with them for a lifetime; this is a special place to live. Now its time to enjoy the magic of fall in Fair Haven!

PET WASTE AND WATER POLLUTION

Pet waste is carried by rain, melting snow, and ice to storm drains that empty into rivers, lakes, and the ocean. It also reaches reservoirs which supply much of the drinking water in New Jersey.

Pollution due to pet waste negatively impacts swimming, boating and fishing in these water bodies.

Pet waste contains microorganisms that can cause bacterial diseases, roundworms and parasitic infections.

In addition, pet waste contains harmful levels of nutrients which promote excessive algae and plant growth. This can rob the waterbody of oxygen, potentially killing all aquatic life in the area. Such nutrient pollution also causes waters to become cloudy and green.

Thanks to our supporters the 2022 Red Bank CROP Walk was a resounding success. Over \$134,000 was raised and 17,000 pounds of food donated. 2022 RBCW: the 4th largest walk in the US! As we make plans for our 43rd annual walk---five miles through three towns, a food drive, art contest, music and refreshments---we ask for your support. Volunteers are needed: water stop staff, crossing ‘guards’, walk monitors and those who can spread the word on social media. New walkers and sponsors are always welcome!

As in years past, hundreds of walkers will come together this Oct. 15th to raise funds that help support 14 local charities* and the global programs of Church World Service, which provides items like hygiene kits, blankets, school supplies and baby items which are stored in warehouses for quick response to hurricanes, floods and fires and the food donated by our walkers help fill the shelves of many local food pantries.

In the wake of global disasters, this year’s CROP Walk theme is “Building Resilience”. The goal is helping those displaced from their homes, by calamities natural and manmade, become self-sufficient in new homes.

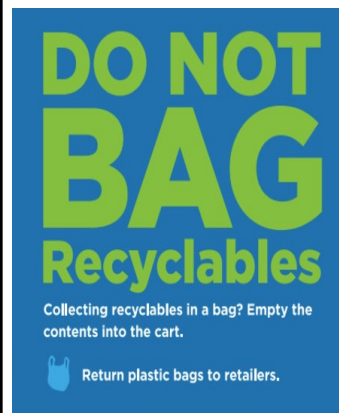


REASONS TO PICK UP AFTER YOUR PET

Fair Haven Volunteer First Aid Squad Kicks off its 2023 FUND DRIVE

The Fair Haven Volunteer First Aid Squad has, for 93 years, provided dedicated service and support to the community and is asking the residents and businesses to support us during our annual fund drive. Just as area residents and businesses depend on the squad to be there when they call 9-1-1, the organization depends on donations from the community to provide that support.

The Squad would like to stress the importance of house numbers being visible from the street. Precious moments could be lost if a responding emergency vehicle must search for an unnumbered house. Motorists should remember that state law requires you to yield right of way to vehicles displaying a flashing or revolving red or blue light. The Fair Haven Volunteer First Aid Squad annual fund drive letter will be mailed out to all homes and businesses in the borough. Each year the tax-deductible donations go directly to purchasing medical supplies, equipment and help to off-set the cost of keeping members trained to increasing professional standards. Last year (2022) the squad responded to 467 emergency calls and donated 2392 man hours.

Our members contribute many hours answering emergency medical calls, responding to vehicular accidents, fires, participating in drills, and continuing education activities. They also participate in first aid & safety demonstrations for local schools, scouts and other organizations, as well as provide mutual aid support to activities and events sponsored by Fair Haven and our surrounding communities. This fund drive will be our main fund raiser. The Fair Haven Volunteer First Aid Squad does not charge for its services. Our Squad is actively replacing outdated equipment and adding new equipment that meets or exceeds state standards; your anticipated 2023 donation will be greatly appreciated, and will serve to defray some of those equipment expenses.
